

## Dubai (UAE) Tourist Visa Checklist — For Indian Nationals

1. **Passport**
  - Valid for at least 6 months from date of travel. [OBJ]
  - Clear copy of passport's bio-data pages (first & last pages) [OBJ]
    - At least 2 blank pages (recommended) [OBJ]
2. **Visa Application Form**
  - Completed & signed application. [OBJ]
  - Sometimes done online / via an airline or travel agency. [OBJ]
3. **Photograph**
  - Recent passport-size photo (white background). [OBJ]
  - Follow the required dimensions (e.g., 35 × 45 mm, depending on the source) [OBJ]
4. **Travel Tickets**
  - Confirmed return or onward ticket. [OBJ]
  - May be mandatory in application. [OBJ]
5. **Proof of Accommodation**
  - Hotel booking or confirmed accommodation for your stay. [OBJ]
    - If staying with someone (friend/family), you might need a sponsor / invitation + their address / ID. [OBJ]
6. **Financial Proof**
  - Bank statements (recent months) to show sufficient funds. [OBJ]
    - For longer visas, they may ask for stronger financial proof (some sources mention a certain income / balance requirement). [OBJ]
7. **Travel / Health Insurance**
  - Travel insurance is highly recommended. [OBJ]
  - Some sources explicitly list “health insurance valid in Dubai.” [OBJ]

8. **NOC or Additional Documents (if applicable)**
    - **For female applicants traveling alone: an NOC from parents or spouse might be required.** [OBJ]
    - **For a visit visa via a sponsor: invitation letter, sponsor's Emirates ID, tenancy proof, etc.** [OBJ]
  9. **Visa Fee**
    - **The cost depends on visa type (30-day, 60-day, etc.). For example, according to Emirates: 30-day single-entry visa is ~US\$90.** [OBJ]
    - **Some e-visas or pre-approved visas have different validity or extension options.** [OBJ]
  10. **On Arrival / Pre-Approved Options**
    - **Some Indians may be eligible for visa-on-arrival if they have certain valid visas or residence permits.** [OBJ]
    - **Check the latest eligibility and rules before traveling.**

### **Tips & Warnings**

- **Use a reliable visa agent or official portal to apply — mistakes in documents can lead to delays.**
- **Make sure scanned copies are clear and legible.**
- **Apply well in advance, especially during peak travel season.**
- **Keep hard copies of all documents, including your approved e-visa, while traveling.**
- **Double-check latest rules, as visa policies may change.**
